<u>Please stop all of the following medications 7 days prior to surgery. These</u> include but are not limited to:

Motrin (Ibuprofen), Advil, Aleve
 Dipyridamole
 Mobic
 Feldene
 Persantine
 Relafen
 Nuprin
 Naprosyn
 Voltaren

• Bufferin

Lodine

• Aspirin (325 mg/day or more should be stopped; baby Aspirin 81 mg/day can be continued)

**NOTE:** If you get a headache and need to take something within a week prior to your surgery, you can take Tylenol (acetaminophen).

If you are taking **Plavix**, this will need to be stopped **10 days** prior to your surgery.

If you are talking **Coumadin, Xarelto or Pradaxa,** these medications need to be stopped **6 days** prior to your surgery.

Please remember to FAST from midnight on the night before your surgery. THIS MEANS NOTHING TO EAT OR DRINK AFTER MIDNIGHT THE NIGHT BEFORE YOUR OPERATION.

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
